#### **METROBUS**

### **Re-routing of Traffic – Avon Crescent & Ashton Avenue**



In conjunction with the MetroBus, *Bristol City Council* are looking to re-route traffic at the western end of Spike Island Bridge. The traffic lights on Seaton Road Bridge will be removed and the bridge will afford a continuous two-way flow of traffic. North-bound traffic will go over Smeaton Road Bridge, around the roundabout, under McAdam Way, and along Brunel Lock Road to exit spike Island at Junction Lock Bridge. The turn right from Cumberland Road into Avon Crescent will blocked for all but Exceptional Loads.

Bristol City Council are building on the changes; proposing that:

- Brunel Lock Road will become two-way, so southbound traffic from Junction Lock
   Bridge will use it to access the roundabout under Madam way, then turn own
   Cumberland Road.
- The southern end of Ashton Avenue will be closed to all through traffic. The approach to the Crate Centre will be from the roundabout into Smeaton Road, which will become two-way at the point.
- Avon Crescent will be closed to all through traffic save for Exceptional Loads.

Bristol City Council are currently open to feedback on the proposals listed, so if you have any comment please get in contact with them. For more information, please see the leaflets on the noticeboard upstairs.
