School Games Regatta!

On 20th June, the sailing, rowing and canoeing skills of 10 schools were put to the test in the School Games Regatta. Since April these schools have been learning sailing, rowing and canoeing at All-Aboard! in preparation for the regatta, where all the schools competed in each sport.

It was great to see the students mixing with other schools and students from different backgrounds and abilities. This regatta is



unique in its inclusivity as each mainstream school must have at least 3 students with Special Educational Needs (SEN). In addition, two of the schools were SEN Schools, increasing diversity and the range of abilities and strengths amongst the students further.

One teacher said "This is a great programme. The students are learning all sorts of skills and the students with SENs are participating with their classmates in sports, which would normally be difficult".

All students were awarded medals and had a great time thanks to the hard work of our instructors and volunteers who worked non-stop to deliver a faultless day. Thank-you to all volunteers for your hard work during the programme, helping us deliver a great School Games.







A Busy Month

With the School Games coming to an end, the after-school club selling out each week and a rise in Sailability activities, it certainly has been a busy month. We have had 1,568 attendances with 777 people visiting our centre. Out of the 855 people, 85 were 55+ years old, 557 were under 18 years old. In our Sailability sessions, we had 223 attendances from 141 people, 64 of whom came more than 3 times and 4267 hours of activity were delivered. So it has been a busy time.

captained by John Cabot. To mark the anniversary, our 55+ rowers joined in arms with other Gig clubs to TOW 'The Matthew' in our hand-crafted boats. Yes, TOW! This was the traditional method to get large boats out of the harbour, thus is the method the original 'The Matthew' would has started her voyage in 1947.

Generous Donations

This month we received two generous donations to fund a new pioneer boat for disability watersports sessions.

David Bowers, a member of Chew Valley Sailing Club, approached All-Aboard at the beginning of the month to give a charitable donation of £10,000 funded by his previous employer's charitable trust, to be used for disability watersports. It was agreed by David and the Trustees that this generous donation would be used to fund a new and much needed Pioneer powerboat. These



powerboats have a drop down front, allowing wheelchairs users and individuals with limited movement to easily come aboard and enjoy our harbour trips. These boats are a fundamental part of our fleet, so the new addition of this boat will enable us to deliver more trips to meet the growing numbers in disability watersports and reach more groups in the community.

David kindly handed over a large cheque during the School Games and presented the medals to the children.

Andy Holmes, previous owner of Wet and Windy, and his family recently gave a generous donation to Sailability. Andy worked closely with All-Aboard (previously WESSA), for over a decade through his business by providing discounted boats and equipment and donations. Now as a Sailability service user Andy and his family continue to support our work, so we are delighted to announce that their



contribution will be used for an engine for the new Pioneer; reflecting the driving force he has been over the years.
